- **Get good colleagues**

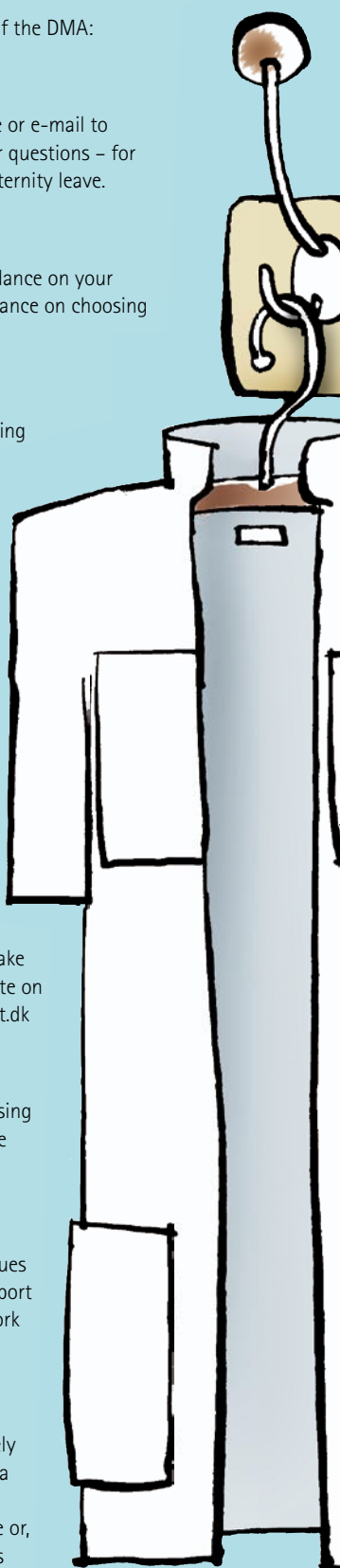

- **Be active**

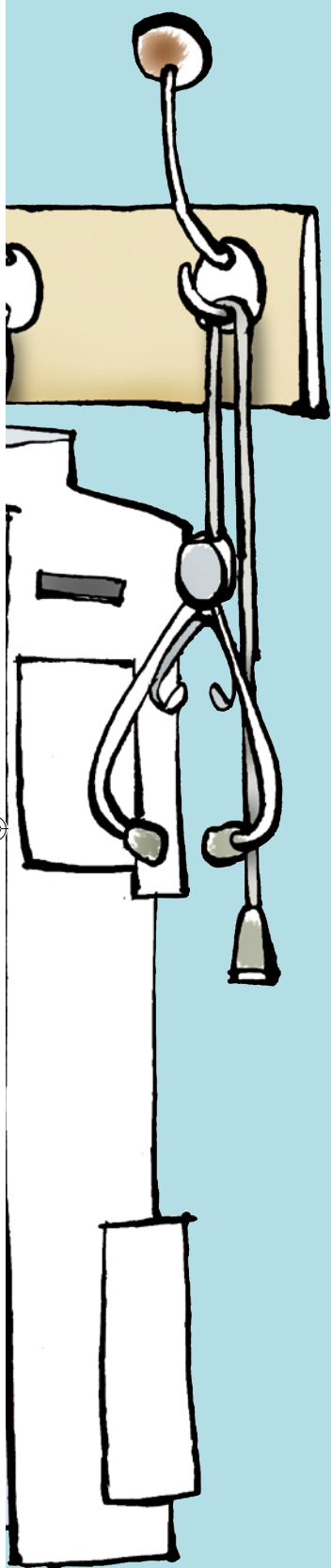
As a member you can participate actively in the organisational work – and make a difference – for example as trade union representative, as a DMA representative or, as a member of one of the association's teams/committees.

### **The Danish Association of Junior Doctors (YL)**

The objectives of the Danish Association of Junior Doctors are to protect the professional and financial interests of junior doctors.

There are 10,396 members of the Danish Association of Junior Doctors – of which 59% are women and 41% men. The average age among the active junior doctors is 38.5 years.

Most members are in specialist training and 26% are medical specialists.

### **The Danish Association of Medical Specialists (FAS)**

At present the Danish Association of Medical Specialists has 9,057 members divided into ten separate independent organisations.

The objectives of the ten separate organisations are to protect the members' professional, financial and collegial interests and handle the collective negotiations.

The Board is the highest authority of the Danish Association of Medical Specialists. The members of the board are the chairmen of the ten organisations.

### **The Danish Organisation of General Practitioners (PLO)**

The organisation is a nation wide organisation under the Danish Medical Association. The objectives of the PLO are to protect the professional and financial interests of the general practitioners.

The members are doctors who practice general medicine as their main occupation and who are members of the Danish Medical Association.
