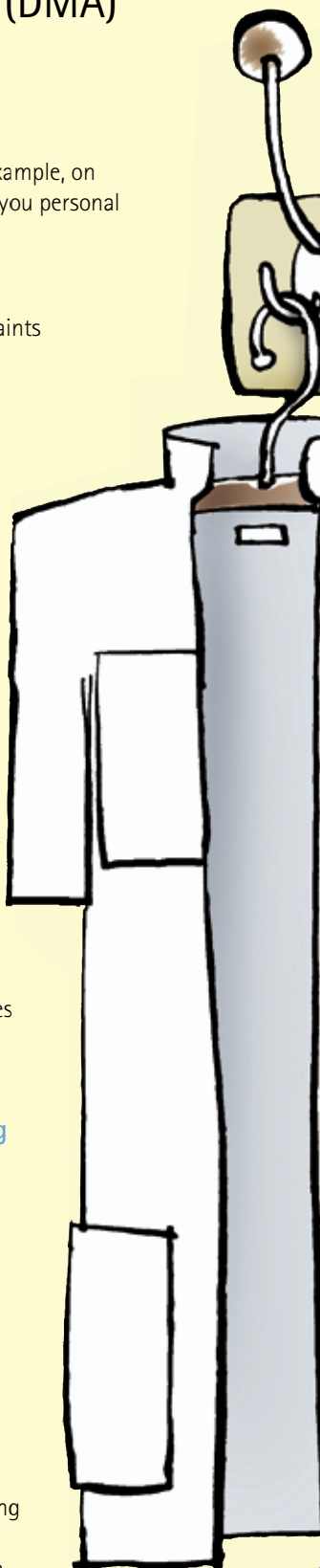

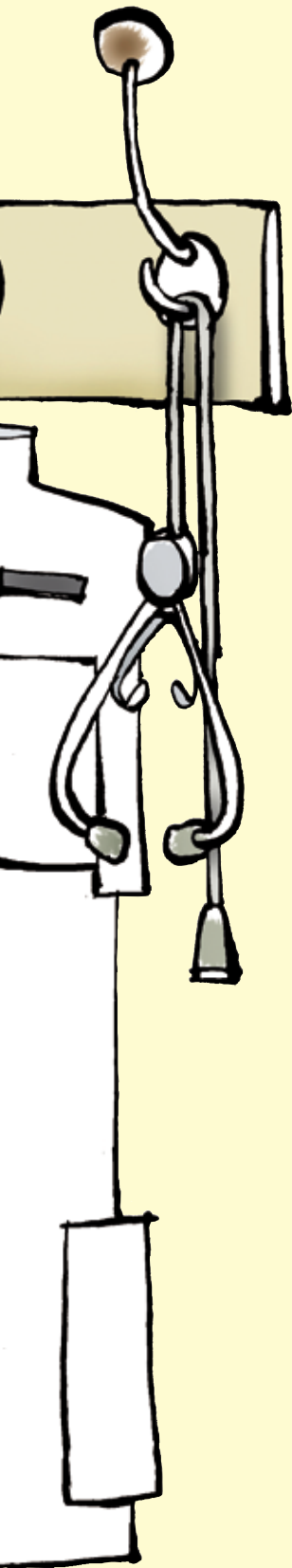

The Danish Medical Association (DMA)

The Danish Medical Association is the professional and political organisation for doctors working in Denmark. Almost all doctors working in Denmark are members. This gives us a strong voice in representing the political interests of doctors. At present there are 27,611 members of the Danish Medical Association. When you join the DMA, you automatically become a member of one of the associations listed below.

The Danish Association of Junior Doctors (YL)

The objectives of the Danish Association of Junior Doctors are to promote the professional and financial interests of junior doctors. Most members are in specialist training and 26 % are medical specialists. At present there are 11,487 members of the Danish Association of Junior Doctors.

The Danish Association of Medical Specialists (FAS)

The objectives of the Danish Association of Medical Specialists are to promote the professional and financial interests of medical specialists. The members are divided into nine separate independent organisations. At present there are 8,205 members of the Danish Association of Medical Specialists.

The Danish Organisation of General Practitioners (PLO)

The objectives of the Danish Organisation of General Practitioners are to promote the professional and financial interests of the general practitioners. The members are doctors who practice general medicine as their main occupation. At present there are 5,203 members of the Danish Organisation of General Practitioners.
